<u>Counting Jar</u> Find a jar and fill it with some objects. See if someone in your family is able to guess how many objects are in your jar. Count the objects to know if their guess is correct.	Students will be read to for 20 minutes each day a story of their choice. Use the EPIC login and practice reading and listening to stories (complete quiz if applicable). If you do not have online access, choose any story from home.	Draw a picture of a room within your home, and then label the objects in your picture with the help of someone. Please bring your completed picture back with you when school resumes.	<u>Weather Chart</u> Create a chart that keeps track of the weather that occurs each day. Make a prediction about which weather type you think will happen the most. At the end of the week, discuss how many days it was cloudy, sunny, snowy, rainy, or windy.
<u>Skip Counting</u> Practice counting by 10's all the way up to 100!	<u>With INTERNET ACCESS:</u> Go to www.ixl.com and practice your skills for 20 minutes. We will assign skills that we would like you to address.	Say and then try to write as many rhyming words as you can come up with for each word: - Mat - Dog - Sit - Run - Bet	<u>Spring vs. Winter</u> Fold a piece of paper in half. On one half draw some objects that remind you of winter. On the other half draw some objects that remind you of spring. Talk about the objects you have drawn with someone from your family.

<p>Number Hunt Look all around your house and see if you can find numbers hiding in plain sight. Practice saying the numbers that you find and then write them down on a piece of paper that you can bring back to school.</p>	<p>Read a non-fiction text from home (remember non-fiction is something that really happens). Talk about the main idea and details in the story. Draw a picture of your favorite part! If you do not have one at home, you may look for a nonfiction story using the EPIC login, such as <u>My Healthy Body</u> by Bobbi Kalman.</p>	<p>Rainbow write your first and last name. (write your name and trace it with at least 3 different colors just like we do at school!)</p>	<p><u>With INTERNET ACCESS:</u></p> <p><u>FRECKLE</u> Go to www.student.freckle.com and complete the weather assignment that is located under the “From My Teacher” icon on your home screen.</p>

Have them write down your responses on a piece of paper that you can bring back to school.</p>
