I suggest going to this site <https://library.sd.gov/> and then go to databases and click on it. They are then in alphabetical order. A couple I would recommend are ProQuest Research Library and MAS Ultra School Edition. Many of them would be good for you. Be sure to keep track of the sources you use because you will need that later.

Once you find a good source, start to take notes of information you can use for your speech. Keep them in a notebook or notecards.

Due by Friday, April 3 at 4:00 is your topic, your thesis statement, and three sources you will use.
