After reading the book discuss whether or not your prediction was correct.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Write your capital letter A-Z.</p> <p>Guardian: Write the letters A-Z on a piece of paper for a guide. Your child can write their letters next to yours.</p>	
	<p>Read a book outside! Take a book outside and find a quiet place to read. (You could also take a stuffed animal outside and retell a favorite story)</p>	<p>Go on a nature scavenger hunt. Draw pictures or take notes of the interesting things you find.</p>
